An outline for worship at home

Though we may pray alone we are part of God's worldwide family.

The term 'Spiritual Communion' has been used historically to describe the means of grace by which a person, prevented from sharing in a celebration of the Eucharist, nonetheless shares in the communion of Jesus Christ. The form of prayer below offers Christians an opportunity to give thanks for their communion with him.

<u>Take time to be still</u>. Light a candle, gaze at an icon, listen to the birds or music – whatever helps you. Remember that God loves you.

Praise God in your own words, or in a hymn, or use Psalm 100:-

- 1. O be joyful in the Lord all the earth, serve the Lord with gladness and come before his presence with a song.
- 2. Know that the Lord is God: it is he that has made us and we are his: we are his people and the sheep of his pasture.
- 3. Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise, give thanks to him and bless his name
- 4. For the Lord is gracious, his steadfast love is everlasting, and his faithfulness endures from generation to generation

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and shall be for ever. Amen

<u>Prayer</u> May the light of your presence, O Lord, set our hearts on fire with love for you, now and for ever, Amen

Confession call to mind your shortcomings, and trust in God's forgiveness.

Prayer Open my eyes O Lord, that I may behold the wonders of your law.

Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil, For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever, Amen

Thanks be to you, my Lord Jesus Christ, for all the benefits you have given me, for all the pains and insults you have borne for me. Since I cannot receive you now sacramentally, I ask you to come spiritually into my heart. O most merciful redeemer, friend and brother, may I see you more clearly, love you more dearly, follow you more nearly, day by day, Amen.
